## **\$\$\$ REFUNDS**

You may qualify for one or both refunds from the State of Minnesota based on your 2016 Property Taxes. If you owned and occupied this property on January 2, 2016 as your homestead, you may qualify for one or both of the following refunds:

<u>The Property Tax Refund</u> - If your taxes exceed certain income-based thresholds, <u>and</u> your total household income is less than \$107,930.


<u>The Special Homestead Credit Refund</u> - If you also owned and occupied this property as your homestead on January 2, 2015 and:

• The net property tax on your homestead increased by more than 12 percent from 2015 to 2016, and

• The increase was at least \$100, not due to improvements on the property.

## **Senior Citizens' Property Tax Deferral**

The Senior Citizens' Deferral Program was established to help senior citizens having difficulty paying property taxes. This deferral program allows senior citizens to leverage the equity in their home, providing two primary advantages:

- It limits the annual out-of-pocket payment for property taxes to 3 percent of total household income, and It provides predictability. The amount you pay will not change for as long as you participate in this program.

To be eligible, you must file an application by July 1, 2016, as well as:

- 1. Be at least 65 years old,
- 2. Have a household income of \$60,000 or less, and
- 3. Have lived in your home for at least 15 years.

If you pay your first half or second half property tax after the due dates, a penalty will be added to your tax. The later you pay, the
greater the penalty you must pay. The table below shows the penalty amounts added to your tax if your property taxes are not
paid before the date shown.
